Tropical Dreams: A People's History of South Florida

Explore 12,000 years of South Florida history in the museum's core exhibition, *Tropical Dreams*. Climb aboard a 1920s trolley, take a video tour of historic neighborhoods, and see a Haitian boat and a Cuban raft that brought refugees to Miami.

Highlights include the Spitz planetarium projector from the former Miami Science Museum, an airboat and Everglades skiff, and the marquee neon from the Miami Theater. 
