Mythic Creatures: Dragons, Unicorns & Mermaids July 8, 2023 – March 31, 2024

Mythic Creatures: Dragons, Unicorns & Mermaids traces the natural and cultural roots of some of the world's most enduring mythological creatures from Asia, Europe, the Americas and beyond. This exhibition includes imaginative lifesized models including a kraken, whose 12-footlong tentacles appear to rise out of the floor of the gallery as if surfacing from the sea. Paintings and textiles – along with cultural objects from around the world ranging from a Chinese Parade dragon to Greek coins – bring to light surprising similarities and differences in the ways people around the world have been inspired by nature to envision and depict these strange and wonderful creatures.

This exhibition is organized by the American Museum of Natural History, New York (amnh.org), in collaboration with The Field Museum, Chicago; Canadian Museum of Civilization, Gatineau; Australian National Maritime Museum, Sydney; and Fernbank Museum of Natural History, Atlanta.

Mythic Miami

Tropical Dreams: A People's History of South Florida
