

# Sensory Sunday Participant Guide



Thank you for joining us for our Sensory Sunday! The Museum is committed to providing inclusive experiences for all visitors and we are excited to welcome you at the museum for this special program series. Designed for families of children, teenagers, and young adults with disabilities who are neurodiverse, on the autism spectrum, or have sensory processing disorders or cognitive disabilities, Sensory Sundays provide a sensory inclusive experience during your visit to the Museum. Enjoy building block activities, a sensory room, an incredible foam station, and a touch tour of our permanent exhibition, *Tropical Dreams: A People's History of South Florida*, or explore the museum's exhibitions at your own pace.

Spaces in the museum will have modified lighting and sound to support a sensory inclusive environment. Quiet areas and a sensory room will also be available. Community resource providers will be available on-site.

Our Sensory Sunday programming will take place before the museum is open to the public from 10:00 am – 1:00 pm.

## **Getting to the Museum**

#### **Parking**

HistoryMiami Museum is located at 101 West Flagler Street on the plaza level of the Miami-Dade Cultural Center. You can park in the **West Lot Garage**. To get to the museum, exit the Garage and make a right on NW second Avenue. Make a left at Flagler Street and the stairs to the museum are on the left. Parking for Museum visitors with validation is a flat rate of \$5. Parking may be validated at the Museum's Visitor Services desk.


#### **Public Transit**

The Museum is conveniently located across from Government Center Station. To access the Miami-Dade Cultural Center Plaza, you may choose to take the stairs, the ramp, or an elevator up to the second floor. See below a plaza map with arrows identifying the accessible routes.

#### **Drop-off Areas**

HistoryMiami Museum is located on the plaza level on the Miami-Dade Cultural Center across from the Miami Dade County Library. There are multiple ways you can enter the plaza level. You can take the stairwell to the plaza level located on Flagler Street across from, a ramp near the corner of Flagler and NW 1st Avenue, or the stairs located on NW 1st street across from the Government Center. Please see the map below for the accessible routes to the Miami-Dade Cultural Center Plaza.

### **Entrances**

The Museum is located on the plaza level of the Miami-Dade Cultural Center. The plaza level is accessible by elevator from Government Center.

The Museum is comprised of two buildings, North Building and South Building. The North Building is equipped with automatic sliding doors, which are centrally located. The South Building is equipped with a power-assist door on the far left of the entryway.

Sensory Sunday will take place in both the museum's North Building and South Building. You may choose to check-in in either building. Please see the museum's Visitor Guidelines prior to your visit.

## **Sensory Sunday Program Schedule**

The following activities will be ongoing between 10:00 am and 1:00 pm:



Check-in

Ongoing from 10:00 am to 1:00 pm North or South Building Lobbies

Check-in at the check-in table in the lobby of both our North and South Buildings. At check-in, you will be asked for the name(s) you have registered under for the Sensory Sunday program. Visitors will receive and asked to wear a wristband to show that you have checked in.

You may check out a Sensory Backpack and noise-reducing headphones to be used at the museum at the Visitor Services Desk. Please return these items at the end of your visit to the museum.



**Building Blocks** 

Ongoing from 10:00 am to 1:00 pm
North Building Mural Gallery

A building blocks station for quiet, hands-on play, will be available in our North Building Mural Gallery. This drop-in activity will be ongoing throughout the morning.



Incredible Foam Station

Ongoing from 10:00 am to 1:00 pm Folklife Gallery

An incredible foam station for quiet, hands-on play, with be available in our Folklife Gallery, located on the lobby level of the museum's South Building. This drop-in activity will be ongoing throughout the morning.

The following activities will be ongoing between 10:00 am and 1:00 pm:



Tropical Dreams: A People's History of South Florida Touch Tables Ongoing from 10:00 am to 1:00 pm North Building, Third Floor

If you prefer to explore the museum's exhibitions at your own pace, you can visit our three touch tables located inside our *Tropical Dreams* exhibition. Hosted by our Museum Educators, each table will have items from our teaching collection that help tell the story of South Florida's history. This drop-in activity will be ongoing throughout the morning.



**Sensory Room** 

Ongoing from 10:00 am to 1:00 pm South Building, Theater

Experience the museum's sensory room, located in the museum's South Building Theater. Explore the sensory room's interactives in this low light environment. The sensory room will be available throughout the morning.

Self-Guided Experience Ongoing from 10:00 am to 1:00 pm North and South Building Exhibitions



Explore the museum's exhibitions at your own pace! View Tropical Dreams: A People's History of South Florida; Miami, The Magic City photography exhibition; and our Whitman Family Gallery in the museum's North Building.
